At our April meeting it was agreed upon to hold an Exhibition in the Autumn. As the time drew nigh, some thought it impractable as fruit was so scarce.

The Exhibition was held at the Paradise Cheese Factory, and ground surrounding. Quite a large number of cattle were upon exhibition. There was some fine stock. There were several blood mares and colts, also saddle horses and sheep. The stock as a whole made a very good appearance.

The fruit exhibition excelled anything of the the kind ever exhibited in the Society before.

Grain, roots and cereals, though not abundant, did credit to the exhibitors.

There was a very small quantity of butter exhibited, but of very fine quality. Also a very small quantity of grapes.

The Exhibition as a whole was considered quite a success, and will be the means of increase of energy in the future.

After the judges got through with their duties the Society partook of an excellent dinner prepared at the residence of A. Longley, Esq., President of the Society.

The next in order was the reading by the Secretary the report of the judges, which showed that nearly all the exhibitors got prizes, more or less.
