EXCHANGE OF NOTES BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA AND THE SECRETARY GENERAL OF THE UNITED NATIONS CONSTITUTING AN AGREEMENT CONCERNING THE CONTINUITY OF PENSION RIGHTS BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA AND THE UNITED NATIONS JOINT STAFF PENSION FUND

EXCELLENCY,

I have the honour to refer to discussions which have taken place between representatives of the Government of Canada and of yourself concerning arrangements to secure continuity of pension rights in accordance with Article 13 of the Regulations of the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund. Attached to this note is a statement concerning the continuity of pension rights between the Government of Canada and the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund.

I have the honour to propose that this Note and its annex, both of which are authentic in English and French, and your reply shall constitute an Agreement between the Government of Canada and the Secretary-General of the United Nations which shall enter into force on approval by the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Board and the concurrence of the General Assembly and shall remain in force until terminated by either party on six months' notice to the other.
