BISSETT, MAN.—ASSISTANCE FOR UNEMPLOYED MINE WORKERS

Mr. Ed. Schreyer (Springfield): Mr. Speaker, my question is directed to the Minister of Citizenship and Immigration in his capacity as the minister of manpower. I should indicate that I have given him notice of my question.

My question relates to the sudden and unilateral decision of San Antonio Gold Mines Limited to close the operation of the gold mine at Bissett, Manitoba. In view of this situation, has the department taken any action either to help the company recruit skilled mine labourers or to establish a special national employment service office in that town in order to assist the people to find employment elsewhere in the country?

Hon. Jean Marchand (Minister of Citizenship and Immigration): Mr. Speaker, I thank the hon. member for giving me notice of his question. A team of manpower officers under a regional director left Winnipeg this morning for Bissett. They will be located there for a period of time and will try to find employment and carry out consultations in order to direct some workers according to our training programs. They will also consider the situation in order to discover the extent to which we can apply our mobility manpower program. I might say that we are working in co-operation with the Manitoba provincial department of labour in this regard.
