HIGHWAY ACCIDENT STATISTICS

Question No. 870—**Mr. Gundlock:**

What are the statistics concerning highway and street accidents resulting in bodily harm and fatalities that show make and model of the automobiles involved?

Hon. Robert Winters (Minister of Trade and Commerce): No information is available on the make of automobile involved in motor vehicle accidents. In 1964, the total number of passenger cars involved in accidents in Canada was 370,236. Of this number, 2,953 were fatal accidents and 97,130 involved non-fatal injuries. Information is not complete on the number of vehicles involved in accidents by year of model, as data are not available for the provinces of New Brunswick, Quebec, Ontario, Manitoba and British Columbia. However, information by year of model is available for the provinces listed below.
