tise to develop identified projects to a feasibility stage for international donor financing. Examples of such studies include: preparation of the Lower Uva Regional Development Master Plan; preparation of the Tea Master Plan; and advisory services to the ministries of Mahaweli Development, Industries, Housing, and Fisheries. Duration was 1978-83.

(v) Embilipitiya Paper Mill: A grant of \$1.75 million to provide Canadian technical assistance to train mill management and staff in the management, operation, and maintenance

of the National Paper Corporation's mill at Embilipitiya. Duration was 1976-80.

(vi) Commodities/fertilizer loan: A loan of \$20 million for the provision of Canadian industrial raw materials and fertilizer to support agricultural and industrial production. Duration was 1978-82.

(vii) Potash grant: A grant of \$30.5 million for the provision of Canadian potash fertilizer, and technical assistance for potash research. Duration 1981-84.

MEASURE TO PROVIDE GOVERNMENT OPERATED POOL SYSTEMS

The House resumed from Monday, June 27, 1983, consideration of Bill C-95, an Act to provide for Government operated pool systems on combinations of athletic contests and events and to amend the Criminal Code and the Income Tax Act, as reported (with amendments) from the Standing Committee on Communications and Culture; and Motion No. 3 (Mr. Reid, St. Catharines).
