“both official languages and where it is deemed appropriate for supervisors to be able to communicate in both official languages with officers and employees of the institution in the exercise of their supervisory responsibility, these supervisory positions be declared bilingual non imperative, and”.

“(3) If within a period of thirty sitting days from the day the Government has laid before the House of Commons or published in the *Canada Gazette* a proposed regulation prescribing any part or region of Canada or any place outside Canada to be designated as bilingual, an objection in writing, in the form of a motion for consideration by the House of Commons of the matter of the objection, signed by not less than ten members of the House of Commons and filed with the Speaker specifying the reasons for the objection, the House of Commons shall, within thirty sitting days after the expiration of that day that the House of Commons is sitting, take up the motion and consider the matter of the objection.”
