## BILL SD-13.

## An Act for the relief of Violanda Fuoco Delage.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Violanda Fuoco Delage, residing at the city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec, wife of Georges Emile Delage, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the town of Riviere-des-Prairies, in the said province, has by her petition alleged that they were married on the eighth day of March, A.D. 1941, at the said city, she then being Violanda Fuoco; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, on the ground of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it 10 is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved. 1. The said marriage is hereby dissolved, and shall be 15 henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes what-soever.
