


## But British Society Belles Are Not Neglecting Empire's Cause.



Will Be Known as Ninety-Second  
and Will Reinforce  
Forty-Eighth.

Arrangements have been completed for the new Highland regiment. It will be known as the "Ninety-Second," and will have the purpose of reinforcing the 43rd Highlanders. It is not intended at present that the regiment will go to the front as a whole, but quotas will be sent from time to time as required.

The majority of the staff of officers will be chosen from the 48th Highlanders. The commanding officer will be named within a few days. Three double companies will be drawn from the 48th Highlanders, and the officers for them as well. One double company will be contributed by the 51st Highlanders of Hamilton, as well as the officers for it.

Details as to uniforms will be attended to at once, and it is expected the total strength will be reached within two weeks. Already between 175 and 200 men have enlisted.
