CANDIDATES ADDRESS VOTERS OF HILLCREST

Outline Municipal Policies at Meeting of Katepayers of the District. FAVOR HYDRO RADIALS. Speakers See in Them First Step Towards Transportation Problem Solution.

A well-attended meeting of the Hillcrest Katepayers Association was held in Hillcrest school last evening for the purpose of hearing candidates for ward six aspirants for the board of control, President John McClelland occupying the chair.

Ald. R. H. Cameron, a candidate for a seat on the board of control, said: "I am in favor of these hydro-radials elected to the city council are elected simply because they belong to every class of the community..."

Controlled by S. P. Spence said: "I am not going to make any election promises. I am bound to no interests or cliques, but if re-elected to the board of control I will use my God-given intelligence to the best of my ability in the best interests of the citizens."

G. A. Archibald, for alderman in ward five, said: "The last council has made the city a laughing stock. We want new blood. We shall know the general consensus of opinion after the first of January in this regard."

J. Albert Thompson, candidate for aldermanic honors in ward five, appealed to the electors as a new man, and said the transportation should take more interest in municipal matters.

J. M. Warren, who is a candidate for re-election as alderman in ward five, in a forceful speech which created a favorable impression on his audience, stated his reasons for advocating in council and attempting a resolution for a fire commission as the best means to solve the problem of the middle in the fire department.

Other questions touched upon by the alderman were the parks, which he said, were not wanted so badly today as before the war; the need of an assessment commission, the jail farm, and the school children.

HYDRO RADIAL PLAN HEARTILY APPROVED

Speakers at British Imperial Association Meeting Commend Sir Adam's Proposal.

PROMOTION IS FAVORED. Donald C. MacGregor States His Views on the Localism Question.

Under the auspices of the British Imperial Association meeting was held last night at the Hotel Victoria, Toronto, the localism question was discussed by Donald C. MacGregor, secretary of the association, and Sir Adam Beck, mayor of Toronto.

Donald C. MacGregor said: "I am in favor of the hydro-radial plan, and I believe the question of safety is being discussed at this time. I think a man who takes his life in his hands at every corner is certainly worth the \$400 paid to the chief."

MacGregor favored hydro-radials coming into the city and showed that the one now running between London and St. Stanley, which was only opened in June, is paying a profit and has reduced the fare one-half cent per mile.

G. Birdsal, aldermanic candidate for ward six, said: "I am strongly in favor of Sir Adam Beck's hydro-radial scheme, realizing that it is one of the great factors to solve the great and ever-present question of transportation."

Controlled by S. P. Spence, ex-Ald. Fred McPherson, Ald. T. Rodan and H. Hodgson, candidate for the board of control, referred to his services during the past six years.
