Throne; or for overthrowing or defeating the Hanover Succession.

They fay, That it is an unreasonable and unaccountable thing, that Men flould condemn them as Facobites. and as Enemies to the Succession ; whereas not one Word of Evidence has ever yet been offer'd to prove the Fact: that it is very ftrange. that in an Affair of fuch a Nature. where a Negotiation requir'd many Hands, none should be found that could bear Witnels of it, if true; and it is no less ftrange, that fuch a Slander should be to carry'd on against them, when not a Man can be found to bear Witness of it.

They fay, They are content before Hand to fubscribe to it, that whoever has had the least Correspondence with the Pretender, or with any Person whatsoever in his Behalf, is guilty of Treason; and they defire as heartily as they can do, that such may be detected, and punished in the most exemplary Manner.

They declare, That fince the lamented Death of their late Sovereign, they have omitted nothing which became them, as dutiful and loyal Subjects,
