After the word "Mission," at the foot of Page 17, read :---

"The most just and proper method of arranging the Clergy "Reserves, would be, simply to carry out the provisions of the "3rd and 4th Victoria, Cap. 78, in all their detail, and make "over to the parties concerned, their appointed shares.

"The Lands called Clergy Reserves, set apart by the Govern-"ment of Upper Canada, between 1791 and 1840, when any "farther reservations were forbidden, amounted to 2,354,668³/₄. "For the sake of easy illustration, we shall assume 2,400,000 "as the quantity, being only deficient by 45,331, too small to "be of any account."
