BRADSTREET'S SUMMARY.

British Columbia. Victoria and Vancouver, Dec. 11.—Business in coast cities continues good, and retail merchants are ordering largely in heavy goods for the spring outfitting trade. Collections generally are fairly satisfactory.

Winnipeg, Dec. 11.—Navigation is at a standstill, owing to the scarcity of boats, but all boats chartered have not returned. Grain movement throughout the country has quieted down, and now averages only about 25,000 bushels per day. Live stock exports have closed for the season. Exports of fat cattle show an increase of about 25 per cent. over last year, which is slightly less than previous years. Cattle exports, including stocker cattle, are the largest on record, and total 65,000 head compared with 52,000 head last year and 50,000 the year previous. The export trade in sheep has not increased, and totals about the same as last year, 10,000 head. This is said to be caused by poor prices in the English market. Shipments of hogs to the Eastern market have been larger. The volume of trade during the winter months, especially during the winter, is said to be better than in any previous year.
