Henry A. King & Co., 12 King-street east, received the following despatch to-day from New York:

The stock market opened weaker in response to-lower quotations from London, and the bear faction for the first few minutes sold freely. Supporting orders soon appeared, and reassuring advices from Washington enabled the buils to drive the bears to cover. A rumor obtained persistent circulation that the United States Supreme Court had handed down a decision is the Nebraska maximum case favorable to the railroads. The advance extended to 1 and 2 per cent, in the general list, with exceptionally larger gains in Metropolitan Street, Railway, Manhattan, People's Gas, Sugar and C. & N.W. The rise in Sugar was accompanied by rumors that in extra dividend would soon be declared, condon houses were moderate sellers, but here was extensive covering. After devery hour prices shaded off fractionally, Messrs. McIntyre and Wardwell have releved the following despatch from New Ork:

New York, Feb. 28.—The Evening Post's financial cable from London says: The stock markets here were heavy and dull to day, due not so much to the later political news as to the liquidation of accounts by defaulting clients at the settlement and to other forced closing of accounts. A sharp fall in Spanish stocks was also an adverse feature. Americans opened dull and lifeless. There is little business in them here, recent buyers awaiting developments in the United States, New York absorbed all the stock offered and the market consequently closed steady to firm.

Gold is in strong demand for New York at 77s 93/d. There are practically no supplies here, and £500,000 has been arranged for shipment from France, I am told on good authority that some eagles may leave the Bank of England this week, I cannot confirm it, and do not expect it. Any heavy drain might raise the bank rate.
