He stated that Mr. Hays was most candid with him, but declined to say anything about the matter until he had been made acquainted with the situation as between his road and the city of Montreal.

He had been absent from his headquarters there for some time, but promised that on his return the matter would be brought under consideration, and that the Mayor would hear from him before long.
