\$50,000 REWARD FOR HIS CAPTURE

Sleuths All Over the World Have Searched in Vain for Murderer of Snell.

Chicago, Dec. 26 .- Willie Tascott is the most elusive will-o'-the-wisp detecives ever chased after. In the ten years of \$50,000 reward for his capture, shrewd sleuths in all the civilized countries of the world have been hunting for Tasoff: Class innumerable have been followed, and over forty arrests made.

The latest of these was the arrest of Frank Farnsworth, who was arrested here last Monday only to be discharged The murder of Amos J. Snell took place on the night of Feb. 7, 1898.
