HOUSE OF COMMONS' MINISTERS HECKLED

ion, for a share of the fishery award. The Attorney-General, Mr. Borden, had given formal notice of such an intention. Under such circumstances it might not be the best policy to continue this large expenditure for fisheries protection.

Mr. Wade of Dalby, N.S., and Mr. Emmerson of New Brunswick contended that the decision of the Privy Council did not take away from the Dominion the right to regulate the fisheries, which involved the obligation to protect them.

After further discussion, it was agreed that the sooner the issue was settled by the courts or by a friendly agreement the better.

Cold Storage for Fish.
Dr. Kendall, in the matter, urged the government to take up the subject of cold storage for the transportation of fresh fish from the Maritime Provinces to the western markets of Canada. He proposed an expenditure of \$30,000 for the establishment of a cold storage warehouse.

Mr. Hackett congratulated the member for Cape Breton upon the success which had attended the bait storage establishments started by him on Prince Edward Island; they had proved a boon to fishermen.

The Public Works estimates were next taken up, and R. L. Borden asked for the attendance of J. B. Charlton, before the public accounts. Mr. Tarte promised that both Messrs. Charlton and Borden would be present.

Plans Sent to England.
On the vote of \$50,000 for the branch of the Royal mint, Mr. Tarte explained that the plans prepared by the architect had been submitted to the Imperial authorities for approval, and as soon as they had been returned would be commenced on the building. It would be located on Nepean Point, and would cost in the neighborhood of \$400,000.

Mr. Puttee asked if the building would be put up by day labor. Mr. Tarte replied in the negative, adding that the work would be done by contract, but the scale of wages would be submitted as usual to the Labor Department. The item passed.

On the vote of \$10,000 for the addition to the Parliament Buildings, Mr. Tarte explained the distribution of the new rooms, and said the sum was \$400,000.

needed for constructing more rooms in the attic. Referring to Dr. Sproule's suggestion, the Minister agreed that the old Railway Commission might be used by the Committee of Agriculture.

Better Quarters for Mr. Borden.
E. F. Clarke put in a plea for better quarters for the leader of the opposition. Mr. Tarte promised that when the new rooms were ready he would see that the leader of the opposition was accommodated as the country and a right to expect him to be [hear]. This item was passed.

The next taken up was the renewed vote of \$50,000 for the Victoria Memorial Museum. Mr. Tarte explained that not much had been done about this building. In the first place, his architect had been abroad looking after plans for the mint. Then there were a great many public works going on. It had been suggested last year that the building should be erected on Major Hill Park, but he would admit his mind was not fully made up. Canada was becoming a great nation, and he had already a valuable collection in the Geological Museum. While neither government had done its duty towards housing it, "we must build for the future," said Mr. Tarte, "so I have not yet chosen a site."
