CANADA CANNOT MAKE UP SHORTAGE IN WHEAT CROP

Deficiency in World's Supply Placed at 36,000,000 Bu.—Demand for Canadian Better.

(Canadian Associated Press Cable.) London, Sept. 20.—Thomas Thom of the Liverpool Corn Exchange estimated this year's shortage at 36,000,000 bushels in the world's wheat available for British needs.

There was a good demand last week for Canadian butter and fresh arrivals. Prices, however, were not materially advanced, but an early rise is expected.
