

CHICAGO, Dec. 10 .- Dr. Woods Hutchinson of New York, addressing the Any Question Could Be Set-American Public Health Association today, said that gauze masks and vaccine were about the only successful methods of fighting influenza. He de-

clared that quarantines and the closing of all public places were "a relic of barbarism" with no value whatever. "With everyone wearing masks in San Francisco," said Dr. Hutchinson, the number of cases of influenza was brought from 2,300 a day down to 300 a day within six days, and business went ahead as usual. They vaccinated 81,000 there, with almost no deaths among

The mask also served to control epidemics of whooping cough and chickenpox in San Francisco. Dr. Hutchinson said, and should prevent the epidemic of other diseases like scarlet fever, where the germs are carried in the nose and throat.
