

all available information, statistical and otherwise, should be obtained without delay and submitted to the people for their consideration and guidance. They should be brought to understand that it is more to their interest, and to that of their children, to conserve the forests of Canada for home manufacture, instead of disposing of the raw material for export. The council of the Montreal board of trade, at some time past, realizing the great importance of the question, and it has receded to no other, has asked the government to commission to look into the whole question of forest reserves, and the development of the forest power, and the solution, which is a lengthy one, mentions the fact that the government has already enquired shall take. It is to be hoped that the recommendations referred to will be made in a timely manner, and that a reliable and instructive report will be forthcoming as early a date as possible. It is the duty of every citizen to know what it needs in order to preserve its forest wealth and turn to the best
