Mr. Mantell uses the version of the tragedy which was prepared for Edwin Booth. Numerous cuts have been made in it and the play reduced to practical length. While some of Shakespeare's most magnificent lines have been sacrificed by his pruning the matter of the play has all been preserved and the tragedy does not at all suffer. In fact for modern stage presentation it might almost be said to be an improvement. Thus the audience is saved the awful scenes attendant upon the blinding of Gloster and the incident is referred to merely to preserve the continuity of the piece.
Since Mr. Mantell's last visit a number of changes have been made in his company. Mr. Walter Campbell who played the Duke of Cornwall last year is this season cast as the Earl of Gloster. Mr. Gordon Burby, who last season played the Earl of Kent is seen this year's product the Earl of Kent.
