There is no equal presentation of the other side; for, so long as the questions between the classes are not live issues in politics, it will be the policy of both parties to let such questions alone as far as they can. It is therefore to the best interests of the people that legislatures shall busy themselves with the questions which really interest the people, instead of spending their time chiefly in scrambling for the people's money and for privileged franchises.
