The Philadelphia Inquirer says:

"It has been a long time since the Lusitania was torpedoed. Many days have gone by, since the United States sent an ultimatum to Germany on this subject of murder. Surely every submarine commander has had his orders since then. Are we to assume from this Arabic incident that there is no intention, on the part of Germany, to respect the ultimatum? If so, then the days of friendly relations between the United States and Germany are limited. The murder of one American must call for positive measures on our part, either that or the confession that we are only bluffing."

TIME FOR DOING, NOT TALKING

The Boston Globe says:

"It will be a question of doing, not talking. President Wilson has exhausted all peaceful and usual means to protect American lives upon the seas. He cannot now repeat what he has already asserted three times. Should investigation prove that it was the Germans who have jettisoned international law, then they have torpedoed the good will of the United States."

The Boston Herald says:

"Is this the answer? When President Wilson dispatched to Berlin his last note on the Lusitania case, it was commonly observed that he would 'look to the Atlantic, rather than to Berlin for his answer. Now that answer may have come."

"It is too early to discuss what the United States should do about it. We must have the facts. If they are as they now seem, the 'trial accountability' message with which our president opened the discussion will stare him and his fellow countrymen in the face."

"Friendship itself prompts it (the United States) to say to the imperial government that repetition by the commanders of German naval vessels of acts in contravention of those rights must be regarded by the government of the United States as deliberately unfriendly."

He said she had broken up five times since they were married, five years ago.

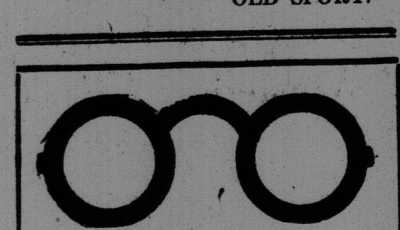

THE 64TH AT SUSSEX

Recruits From Nova Scotia Coming in Steadily and New Brunswick Campaign Will Start Soon

Sussex Record—The 64th Battalion is now being mobilized at Sussex, and from the present outlook several hundred men will soon be under canvas here.

It is hoped to fill the 64th before recruiting starts in New Brunswick for the 64th, but when it does start the campaign promises to be a lively one. Recruits from the 64th have been recruited locally through the kindness of requirements for volunteers, many men who were previously rejected as being below the necessary measurements or through having physical defects, being now accepted, owing to the change in the regulations.

And again, the personality of the commanding officer, Colonel H. Montgomery Campbell, with the men who have been in contact with him, will prove a great incentive for recruits.

A number of young men in Sussex and vicinity have so far registered from joining the colors, have signified their intention of casting in their lot with the 64th. The 64th Battalion is made to get a representative lot of men, and the establishment of the corps is being proceeded with deliberately and carefully.

Up to Wednesday night 180 men had been attached to the 64th Battalion, all of whom came from Nova Scotia. The officers now at camp beside Col. Campbell are, Capt. J. S. Carey, Capt. Hope, paymaster; Lieut. J. H. Wallace, Lieut. L. L. Cameron, and Capt. W. E. Forbes, who has been transferred from the 64th.

Amherst Sends 91

Recruiting for the 64th Regiment is proceeding more than steadily in Amherst. In the first four days of this week, Major Fillmore enrolled thirty men. In the previous fortnight, thirty men were enlisted, so that in all, ninety-one men have been sent from Amherst to Sussex, to join the 64th Battalion, that is being formed at that place.

Bathurst Recruits

Bathurst continues to do her duty in the matter of supplying men to fill up the vacant ranks of the 64th Battalion. Since the last issue was published, the following have been signed on, and all have left for Valcartier, Quebec, to join the 64th Battalion: Mr. J. S. Carey, Capt. Hope, paymaster; Lieut. J. H. JAPAN'S ATTITUDE TOWARDS WAR SHOWN IN CARTOONS

That Japan has aspirations to sit down to the first table with the first-class European powers is indicated by a number of cartoons from the vernacular papers, reproduced in the September issue of Cartoons Magazine.

The "Quadruple Alliance" is represented by a chair. An angel of peace wearing a helmet, it is interesting to note is seen supplying a fourth leg to the chair, which up to this time appears to have had but three.
