WIND CHANGED

Columbia Skipper Thinks Canadian Would Give Him Great Race

Canadian Press, by Wireless ABOARD C. G. S. ARLEUX, off Halifax, Oct. 18.-Bluenose, Captain Angus Walters, defeated Haligonian, Captain Moyle Crouse, in the second race of a series to decide the championship of the Nova Scotia fishing fleets today, but he failed to finish within the time limit of five hours, and a third race will have to be sailed. The schooners raced today under a breeze averaging 20 knots, and moderate swell, but the wind hauled to north as the vessels approached the mouth of the harbor, and when the time limit expired the Bluenose was five minutes from the line. It was proposed at a meeting of the sailing committee last night that the time limit be extended to five and a half hours, but this was voted down. Bluenose gained eight minutes on the first three legs of the course down the wind, and the remainder in the 12 miles beat home. Haligonian with a new balast trim, was faster today than on Saturday, on the wind, but slower if

Captain Ben Pine, skipper of the United States champion Columbia, who was a guest aboard the press boat, expressed the opinion that Bluenose was faster than ever, and would make a wonderful race with Columbia if interpolational series were arranged. ternational series were arranged. 
