Campaign Rallies by Conservatives in Fairville and East Saint John.

Dr. Murray MacLaren, C. M. G., and FAST SAINT JOHN CONSERVA-Thomas Bell, Conservative candidates Thomas Bell, Conservative candidates in Saint John-Albert in the coming federal election, spoke in the Temperance Hall, Fairville, and in the Plaza, East Saint John, last evening. Dr. MacLaren spoke of the Petersen contract, declaring that it had brought nothing but disrepute on its espousers. He also referred to the matter of the Carillon power and said it was the policy of the Conservative party to keep the water power of the country in order to develop home industry.

He arraigned the C. N. R. management for its expenditure of \$181,000 on the chain of radio stations, for the purchase of the Scribe Hotel in Paris and for the purchase of the Union Club in London. He declared that Sir Henry Thornton's former salary of \$50,000 was sufficient and that the recent increase was unwarranted.

He asserted that the Progressive party was on the decline and would soon be extinct.



The Horticultural Branch, New Brunswick Department of Agriculture, reports that the crop is being marketed in good condition. The opinion expressed early in the season by a Montreal buyer that the crop had been allowed to be seriously infested with scab is said to have been unduly pessimistic. New Brunswick apples are said to be as good as the average crop, as far as scab is concerned.
