Rival Towns Hire Illinois and Notre Dame Football Stars and Bet \$50,000 Each—Players All Well Paid.

Chicago, Feb. 1.—The bitter rivalry between two country towns, which became so acute that approximately \$100,000 was bet on a football game, was the real cause of the athletic scandal which resulted in disqualification last year of nine University of Illinois athletes, and which threatens to reach into Notre Dame University.
