

CIVIC AFFAIRS

To the Editor of The Times:

Sir,—In the mayor's letter to the taxpayers one may assume that his remarks were intended for the fifty per cent. of the citizens that were fortunate enough to be able to pay their taxes and retain the less fortunate fifty per cent. that were unable to pay their taxes on account of being robbed by the exploitation system under which we are living—which if not abetted is at least countenanced by the present administration—wishes to point out to the city is deprived of the taxes of upwards of 8,000 citizens, and why the owners of modern and semi-modern houses are called upon to make up the arrears from year to year. There is something radically wrong with the assessment act or there is gross ignorance—or worse—on the part of our civic officials that penalizes owners of modern houses to such an extent they are obliged to demand a rental that is prohibitive to the average family, and places others that are in better circumstances unable to meet their other obligations, taxes included, while at the same time it places a premium on shacks—barely within the legal requirements—that are paying the real estate companies from eighteen to twenty-five per cent. This is a question that should claim the attention of every citizen. The people are being exploited by the real estate companies; the city is being deprived of its just dues; general business and the owners of modern houses are called upon to make up the deficit in the year's business, while the real estate companies are getting off with a ridiculous valuation on which they are earning from eighteen to twenty-five per cent.

Before the advent of the real estate boom of a few years ago, this was a good old city to live in, but since values can only be inflated at the expense of the community, our city is on the toboggan and will soon arrive at the point where it will be utterly impossible for the wage earner to earn a living. A few years ago one could count from twenty-five to thirty sawmills within a radius of four miles. These mills employed thousands of men, directly and indirectly; they paid out thousands of dollars in wages weekly, which was distributed throughout the community. The working men—whom I am one—have driven those mills out of the community through clamoring for wages to keep pace with the cost of living. When our demands of the profiteering landlord and a host of superfluous shopkeepers, we were obliged to demand more pay. Each time we gained an advance of ten per cent. the cost of living jumped to twelve, and made our condition worse. Finally the industry could no longer stand the strain. Some of the largest companies ended in disastrous financial failures; others, to keep from losing in the hands of the sheriff, removed to the interior of the province, where rents and living are cheaper. Today we have only six mills remaining, and but two of them operating at present. To sum up the situation: we have driven our principal industry out of the community, but the community remains, and as nothing but the place of the industry, the community is suffering from lack of employment. The situation has become so desperate that the city is now in operation by adjusting their taxes to suit their respective owners, for which bills are now pending at the city council.

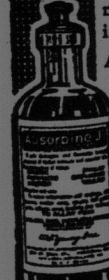
