Each Union Must Vote Before Strike

Executive of British Labor Triple Alliance Cannot Commit All to Strike

London, June 11.—(Reuter's).—All the annual council meeting of the National Transport Workers' Federation, held in Swansea, Will Thorne, Labor M. P., condemned the resolutions in connection with the blockade, which were passed at the "big end" of the triple alliance (miners, railwaymen and transport workers), meeting in Southampton, in connection with the coal crisis. Mr. Thorne said that for his part he was not very much concerned about raising the blockade. He recalled his own position this time last year, when the Germans were sinking every food ship at sight. The Germans, he declared, were absolutely responsible for the present shortage in Great Britain and Germany. The Germans were quite unconcerned during the submarine campaign about depriving our women and children of food. They were unconcerned about the babies there, but now they were crying like big babies because the blockade was still there. J. Havelock Wilson, Coalition Labor M. P. for South Shields, condemned the triple alliance leaders for engaging in ill-directed activities. He declared that capitalists were afraid to develop industry because of the absence of guarantees for the future. A vote of censure on the executive of the transport federation for exceeding its powers in connection with the Southport resolution was defeated by a large majority, but the conference carried Ben Tillett's resolution after permitting the executive to commit unions affiliated with the federation to strike action unless the unions themselves balked at it.

A strike of inter-urban carmen would affect service from Detroit to Toledo as well as a dozen southern Michigan cities.
