

DISTRIBUTION OF CAN-DA'S  
GIFT OF FLOUR IN ENGLAND

London, Dec. 11—More than half of  
the stock of the Canadian gift flour re-  
ceived to date has been distributed, ac-  
cording to a statement made by the  
Montreal Gazette correspondent here to  
an official of the local Government  
Board, which has the flour in charge. A  
good part has been placed at the disposal  
of the War Office and the Admiralty,  
as public distress is not abnormal, and  
there is therefore no pressing need for  
its wide-spread distribution to the poor.  
In these cases where the flour is being  
used for relief by the local committee,  
the loaves baked from it are issued with  
a paper band, on which is inscribed the  
words: "This loaf is made from flour  
sent by the people of Canada."

Near Jelfa, Algeria, there is a moun-
