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SIXTH WITNESS

CYRIL HARTLEY SCOTNEY WAR RESERVE CONSTABLE NO 128 having been duly sworn states:

Q. 1. Do you recognize the accused Lieut. Cahill William Knox,

A. 1. Yes Sir.

Q. 2. You have seen him before,

A. 2. Yes Sir.

Q. 3. Will you relate the circumstances,

A. 3. Yes Sir. ^{12.55} At 12.55 a.m. Friday 4 Sep 42 I saw Lieut. Cahill William Knox of the 1st Field Holding Unit asleep in a doorway at No 40 London Road. He was in Battle Dress Uniform without a hat. I roused him and found him recovering from the effects of drinking. With assistance I took him to a Surface Shelter where he stated that two of his men should have met him with a vehicle from a Dance and inquired if I had seen anything of them. I then connected him with a Motor Vehicle which had been found in this vicinity earlier in the evening which had been collected by the Military Police and I got in communication with another police officer and Lieut. Cahill William Knox was then brought to the Police box and we subsequently took him to the Town Major's Office.

Q. 4. Was Lieut. Cahill William Knox drunk at the time you saw him.

A. 4. He was recovering from drink. He was in a dazed manner but after we walked him up the road he was alright.

The accused declined to question the witness.
