An Order in Council has been passed whereby it is made illegal for threshers to burn straw. In exceptional cases a permit can be secured. The penalty for burning straw is a very heavy one so that it will be an expensive breach of the law for any person or persons caught. Those interested should take note of this new law.

NEW INCREASE IN FREIGHT RATE IS ANNOUNCED.

Regina wholesale and retail merchants have been advised of a further freight rate increase which is to take effect on October 7. This new ruling affects the entire Dominion, as by it the rate per one hundred pounds is advanced by one-half cent a hundred on all carments.

An advance which was made in March this year raised the rates at four points in Canada, all eastern points, and these will again be affected by the latest increase.

The new tariff enumerates a list of exceptions to which the new rate will not apply. These include: Ash shifters, bakers' ovens, baths, brooms (straight shipments), cereals and pop corn (straight shipments), churns, cork, cotton batts, cotton wadding, cream separators, elevators and parts, electric light bulbs, globes, glass hats, machines and machinery (all kinds), portable buildings, stoves, furnaces
