PROF. BELL IS NOW A

DOCTOR OF SCIENCE

Honorary Degree Conferred

by Oxford University

Recipient Becomes Renowned in London

and Speaks of His Inventions and His Aims.

INVENTED THE PHOTOPHONE.

Becoming reminiscent about his other intentions, Prof. Bell said that although everybody knew him as the inventor of the telephone, nobody outside a limited circle knew him as the inventor of anything else, and he was proud to learn that his invention of 1889, the photophone, by means of which speech is transmitted by a beam of light, is unknown in England, except to scientists, although it was used in Germany to establish communication between light-houses and the shore.

Prof. Bell recalled with amusement how, in connection with the invention of the photophone, he was attacked for having claimed to have invented something which never entered his head. He said he deposited, in 1889, in the Smithsonian Institute a sealed package containing his discovery, and, becoming known, led to the announcement that he claimed to have discovered how to see by telegraph. Numbers of people in America and England claimed priority of discovery, as, by the way, they did of the telephone. Scientific papers in the United States and England, as well as newspapers, warred against him. Then he opened the package in the Smithsonian Institute and showed that he never dreamed of seeing by telegraph. The storm then subsided.

HIS MAIN HOBBY.

Asked what was his main hobby now, Prof. Bell said it was sailing.

Speaking on this subject, he declared: "Aside from the scientific pleasure, it would give me great personal joy to perfect a flying machine. It has been the sad thought of my life that neither my wife nor mother were able to use or appreciate the telephone. Both were deaf. The photophone and graphophone were equally useless to my wife, but if I am able to perfect a flying machine I will have done something that my wife will be able to appreciate and perhaps use."

Your correspondent, noting that the hour was very late, apologized for detaining Prof. Bell. He replied cheerfully that his earliest retiring time was four o'clock in the morning, and that when he had important work on hand he did not go to bed for days. His usual rest was seven hours. He said: "I have been keeping these hours for 25 years, and breaking the early to bed, early to rise habit has cost me neither health nor wealth."
