## THE COTTON MARKET IS MORE ACTIVE

Toronto, May 12.—The country grain markets are stagnant as deliveries have been reduced to a minimum, and farmer work has practically shut off deliveries entirely. Most of the business is being done of course in western grain and quotations are based on shipments from lake ports.

Feedstuffs are if anything a little easier as the pasturage is cutting down the demand.

### Montreal Dealers' Quotations.

Receipts of eggs this morning were 1,294 cases against 2,114 for the corresponding date last year.

The market was steady this morning and there was a steady trade doing at well maintained prices. Fresh receipts were quoted at 19c to 19 1/2c per dozen.

### The Potato Market.

The potato market was steady and there was no change to note. Prices were firm and there was a good undertone to the market. Green Mountains were quoted at \$1.15 per bag in car lots on track, and in a small way at \$1.20 to \$1.25 per bag.

Owing to the backward season throughout the country and poor condition of pastures the demand for bait has been increased considerably of late and as supplies on spot are not large a very firm feeling prevails in the market. We quote: No. 1 hay, \$12.50 to \$13; extra No. 2 hay, \$11.50 to \$12; No. 3 hay, \$10 to \$10.50; clover mixed, \$8.50 to \$9; clover, \$7.50 to \$8.

Butter.

Receipts of butter were 1337 packages as against 679 for the same date a year ago. The market was steady and prices were strong and firm. There was a good local demand but so far there has been little doing in the export trade. Fresh receipts were quoted at 21 1/2c to 22c.
