Now that colonial expansion policy hat a mortal duel between them is inevitable. At any rate, the two countries are making preparations, and no macrifice is too great in the domain which is the pivot of all their policy. This is why Germany has created powerful military ports and naval dockyards; why she constructed the Kiel Canal; and why she has developed ther navy so that it should be second only to that of Great Britain. Her aim appears to be to make the Austro-German fleets so strong that, reinforced by the talain fleet, which could hardly refuse assistance, the combined fleets of the three Powers would one day by in a position to dispute with Great Britain with sone chance of success the supremacy of the sea. 


