FINE EXHIBITION OF ETCHINGS IN ST. JOHN Work of Canadian Artists Shown At Art Club Rooms. Peel Street—Local Talent Also Exhibited.

Seldom is St. John privileged to see so many gems of artistic achievement as at the present time when a fine collection of Canadian etchings and lithographs is on exhibition at the Art Club Rooms on Peel street.

Among the most admired of the etchings are those of William Thomson of Toronto, whose Canadian sketches are artistically perfect and whose treatment is very original.

The work of E. L. Leur, of Woodbridge, is very different from the other artists, as the effect is that of charcoal drawings, giving a softness of tone which resembles a mezzotint.

W. R. Stark has good studies of birds, one striking etching of Pea-hens being slightly colored.

The lithographic drawing by Arthur Lisner, O.S.A., of the Victoria school of Art, Halifax, is a very large share of admiration.

Other artists contributing are Mrs. Stas Alward, who has several Romanesque scenes about St. John; Miss Woodburn, pretty woodcut pictures; Miss Clara O. McGivern, well executed water colors of sea and river views; Miss Alice Jack, sketches of St. John scenes; C. H. Flewelling, who shows a painting of the War Fand; and a sepia painting of St. John from the Courtenay Bay Breakwater.

The paintings of Mr. Barber are for sale, a percentage of the money going to the La Comite de Secours of the French Army in the East, which he is secretary. This is a war charity. Among his most exquisite paintings are the one of Nurnberg, and several interiors of Moorish cathedrals.

HAYWOOD AND 92 AIDES IN PRISON

Chief of "Wabblers" Chews Gum and Discusses Chicago Bomb As He Enters His Cell.

Leavenworth, Kan., Sept. 18.—William D. Haywood, secretary of the Industrial Workers of the World, and ninety-two other members of the organization convicted in Chicago on charges of violating the espionage statutes received into the federal penitentiary here this afternoon.
