J. B. Jones, issuer of provincial licenses, calls attention to the fact that it is illegal for any hunter to leave any part of any animal in the woods, and the whole carcass must be brought out. No part of the animal may be sold, but the regulations allow of the placing of the game in cold storage. The section of the act governing the bringing out of the carcass reads:

"All persons killing game in any place within the province, shall not leave the carcass on the ground, or in any of the streams or lakes, under a penalty of \$20 or one month's imprisonment."
