Dr. E. Deville has forwarded to this Department five plans on tracing cloth with a request that they be signed by the Chief Surveyor of this Department. One of these plans shows the right of way of the Grand Trunk Pacific Branch Lines Co., through lands which are not "Indian lands". The other four plans are quadruplicate copies as far as Indian lands are concerned, showing the right of way of the said railway through the surrendered and unsurrendered portions of the Pasqua Indian reserve No. 79. These plans do not agree with the plans filed by the Company showing the said right of way made by J. A. Heaman, D.L.S., dated 23rd April 1910, from which patents for the lands were issued by this Department. The discrepancies which exist are in the areas taken for the right of way and are shown on one of the plans in pencil. If you will have the corrections made on these plans and return them here, they will be signed by the Chief Surveyor. The plans have been sent to you in a separate parcel by registered mail.
