A special meeting of the Band in Council of the Chippewas of the Thames, Caradoc Reserve, held on the foregoing date in the presence of Henry Jones, Esq., Indian Agent, after a due notice given to the Band for the consideration of certain important questions left to the Band to decide the second question for consideration was the question of entertaining at some near future date the surrendering of a piece of land, containing gravel, located near the Village of Middlemiss, bought and owned by Mr. Myles McDougald a member of this Band empowering him to dispose of the gravel in the form of cement blocks to parties outside of the Reserve and in return for such permission he (said Mr. Myles McDougald) to pay in money from time to time to the funds of the Band Ten Per Cent of the value of all the cement blocks so disposed. The cement blocks to be manufactured in the Reserve where said land is located. After some consideration on ~~the~~ the question of entertaining at some near future date the surrendering of said piece of land it was moved by Richard Simon seconded by Henry Anderson that the Band do consider at some near future date the surrendering of said piece of land. The vote of the Band on the question, stood, in favour of motion Nine, (9), Contrary, Fourteen, (14) Motion declared lost.
