CHARLOTTETOWN, P.E.I.

From G.P.Nicholson, City Clerk, May 3, 1935:
"The names as listed on our unemployment list, that is those that are receiving assistance from the City through direct relief, are classified as labourers. There are no professional or other persons receiving direct relief."--Are they not rather longshoremen and fishermen? --From the Dept. of Labor at Ottawa, May 22, 1935: 483 heads of families and 1,636 dependents, making a total of 2, 119 on relief at a Dominion expenditure of \$6,789. in February 1935.

GLACE BAY, N.S.

Total expenditure for relief from 1930 to July 1934, \$972,108.13, of which \$221,905.85 for relief works; Dominion proportion \$305,513.85.--At times, more than one half of the population was on relief.

HALIFAX, N.S.

From Mayor E. J. Cragg, May 1st, 1935: A complete classification of men and women, married and single, on relief, although not including dependents.
