Sir.

The Department desires to direct your attention to the statutory enactment regarding the transfer of an Indian from one band to smother (Sec. 17 of Indian Act)...

Under the provisions of this section, before an Indian of one band is admitted into membership in another band, a unjurity vote of the band or of the Council of the Band must be secured as well, as the assent of the Superintendent Constal.

All applications should be made on forms supplied by the Department and all transfers when approved should be carefully noted in the pay-lists, the date of the transfer and the Tyle number being given in each date.

It is thought advisable to point out that the minor whitures of a widow, who marries a member of another bands must not be transferred with here but must remain members of their former band unless the transfer as above is properly made.
