I have given consideration to your letter of Dacember 5th, which also bears the approval of Mr. O'Brien, in which you deal further with the question of the removal of the Indians from Tuffs Cove.

I regret very much that the location adjoining Dartmouth has proved unsuitable, as I had hoped that
its choice and the consequent action to obtain possession
by the Department would have solved the difficulty in so
far as the Tuft's Cove Indians at least are concerned.

I note your recommendation to purchase the site containing approximately 100 acres in the vicinity of Grand Lake which you state will be of ample area to provide for the needs of all the Indians of the County.

The first thing of course is to obtain a
