HOMESTEAD

REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Territories, excepting 8 and 26, which has not been home-seaded, on reserved to provide wood lots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-onarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the District a which the land to be taken is

s'tuate, or if the homesteader de-sires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottaa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for the District in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A fee entry.

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted as entry for a homescend is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lanus act and the amendments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of

the following plans:—

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three

(2) if the father (or mother, if (2) if the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) or any per-son who is eligible to make a home-stead entry upon the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to

the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(6) If a settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in the manner prescribed by this Act, and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permaneur residence upon farming land
owned by him in the vicinity of
his household, the requirements
of this Act as to residence may
be satisfied by residence upon the
maid land.

or this Act as to residence may be astissed by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same township or an adjoining or connecting township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2) (8) or (9) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 nead of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and nave besides 50 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the nomesteader inw is liable to pave his entry cancelled, and the isno may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT.

Should be made at the end of the three years, before the Local Agent, bub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector. Before making application for patent the settler must give six Commissioner of Dominion Lauds months notice in writing to the at Ottawa of his intention to do so.

INFORMATION

Newly arrived immigrants will receive at the immigration office in Winnipeg, or at any Dominion Lands Office in Manitobs or the Northwest Territories, information as to the lands that are open for entry, and from the officers for as to the lands that are open for entry, and from the officers in charge, free of expense, advice and assistance in securing lands to suit them. Full information respecting the land, timber, coal and mineral laws, as well as respecting Dominion. Lands in the Railway Belt in Fritish Columbia, may be obtained upon application to the Secretary of the Department of the Interior, Ottawa; the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, Manitobs; or to any of the Dominion Lands Agents in Manitobs or the Northwest Territories.
