## **REVISED STATUTES OF CANADA.** PART V.

#### SUPPLEMENTARY.

5. A protest of any bill or note, and any copy thereof as copied by the notary or justice of the peace, shall, in any action be prima facie evidence of presentation and dishonor, and also of service of notice of such presentation and dishonor as stated in such protest.

94. The provisions of this Act as to crossed cheques shall apply to a warrant for payment of dividend.

95. The enactments mentioned in the sedond sched ale to this Act, are hereby repealed. as from the commencement of this Act, to the extent in that schedule mentioned :

Provided, that such repeal shall not affect anything done or suffered, or any right. title or interest acquired or accrued before the com-mencement of this Act, or any legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any such thing right title or interest; 2. Nothing in this Act or in any repeal

effected thereby shall affect the provisions of "The Bank Act :

3. The Act of the Parliament of Great Britain passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of His late Majesty George III, intituled. "An Act to restrain the negotiation of Promissory Notes and Inland Bills of Exchange under a limited sum within that part of Great Bri-tain called England," and the Act of the said Parliament passed in the seventeenth year of His said Majesty's reign, intituled. "An Act for further restraining the negotiation of Promissory Notes and Inland Bills of Exchan ge under a limited sum within that part of Great Britain called England," shall not extend to or he in force in any Province of Canada, nor shal the said Acts make void any bills, notes, drafts or orders which have been or may be made or uttered therein. 96. Where any Act or document refers to

or document shall be construed and shall operate as if it referred to corresponding provisions of this Act.

97. This Act came into force on the first day of September last.
