Ordered also, That Mr. William Pagan; Mr. John Black, and Mr. Chandler be a committee to wait upon His Excel-LENCY the Lieutenant Governor with the Address of this House on the subject of the defenceless state of the frontier parts of the province.

The committee appointed to examine the accounts of the Report of a several persons who have been intrusted with the expenditure of the public money—Reported, That the Honorable John Saunders, Esquire, in obedience to the resolution of yesterday had stated to the committee-

"That from the representations of Carpenters that the boards, " purchased by him for the purpose of erecting a building for the accommodation of the General Affembly and Courts of " Justice, had already sustained damage and were continually "growing worfe-and as many of them were of an indiffer-" ent quality when purchased (although they were the best that " could be procured at the time) he therefore judged it would. "be for the interest of the province to lend certain quantities of "them to a number of Gentlemen who are to replace the " fame next Summer—that he holds himself accountable to "the province to see them re-placed as aforesaid—and that the " fum of twenty six pounds twelve shillings and four pence "fill remain in his hands unappropriated."

The committee appointed for that purpose Reported, That Report of a they had presented to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor the address of this House on the subject of the Fees to be taken in this province and that HIS EXCELLENCY was pleafed to return the following answer there-to, viz.
