So it was passed in the Negative.

And the Question being again proposed, That the Bill be now read the third time ;
The Honorable Mr. *Dorion* moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. *Holton*, That all the words after "now" to the end of the Question, be left out, and the words "re-committed to a Committee of the whole House for the purpose of providing that the oath to be taken by voters under the fifty-fourth section of the said Act shall be in the form following, to wit:—

"You swear (or solemnly affirm) that you are the person mentioned on the list of voters now shewn to you (*showing the list to the voter*) under the name of (*name of the voter as entered on the list*) that you were justly entitled as owner (*or as tenant or occupant as the case may be*) to have your name inserted as a voter in the said list, and had in good faith the property qualification in respect of which you appear as such voter on the said list; that you are a subject of Her Majesty by birth (*or naturalization*); that you are of the full age of twenty-one years; that you have not before voted at this election, either at this or any other polling place, and that you have not received anything nor has anything been promised to you, either directly or indirectly, in order to induce you to vote at this election. So held you God," inserted instead thereof.

And the Question being put on the amendment; the House divided: and the names being called for, were taken down, as follow:—

The Bill was accordingly read the third time.

Resolved, That the Bill do pass, and the title be, "An Act to amend the chapter six of the Consolidated Statutes of Canada, intituled, 'An Act respecting Elections of Members of the Legislature.'"

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the Bill to the Legislative Council, and desire their concurrence.
