FREE TRADE DOOMED. The returns which we publish to-day show that a mighty victory has been gained by the Conservative party, that the bottom has been completely knocked out of the Mackenzie Government, and that the new House of Commons will be composed of a majority of about 70Consercomposed of a majority of about 70 Conservatives. Victory crowned the National Cause everywhere. Ontario has been carried by fiearly three to one, Quebec by over two to one, Nova Scotia, two to one, and Prince Edward five to one. New Temiscoust Brunswick is the only Province in which the Government retain a majority. Many of the most prominent members of the Ministerial party have fallen in the per-Ministerial party have fallen in the perfect holocaust that has swept over the country. Blake, Cartwright, Jones, Coffin, Dymond, Young, McDonald (Centre Toronto,) Wood, Irving, Blain, Devlin, Church, Bertram, Barthe, Cook, and a hot of others are among the slaughtered.
