

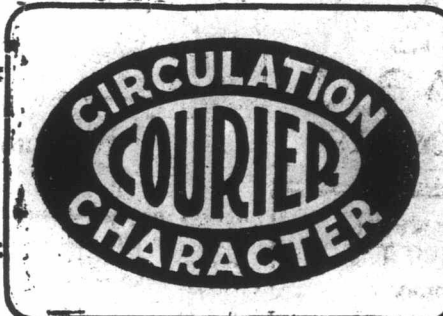

NAVAL OPERATIONS ARE SUCCESSFUL

Sub Shelters And Enemy Work Shops Raided With Good Results

London, Sept. 11.—British naval air forces between September 1 and September 10, made four attacks on German submarine shelters and work shops on the docks at Bruges, according to an official statement issued today by the British Admiralty. Several hits were observed. The German docks and a motor boat depot at Blankenberg also were attacked with good results.

The text follows:

"The operations by royal air force contingents working with the navy during the period from the first to the seventh of September have been considerably hampered by unsuitable weather conditions.

"Submarine shelters and work shops at the Bruges docks have been attacked on four different occasions, direct hits being obtained. The Ostend docks and the coastal motor-boat depot at Blankenberg were also attacked with good results, and a large fire was started.

"Enemy mine sweepers also were harassed with bombs and machine gun fire. More than fourteen tons of bombs were dropped by day bombing squadrons, one machine falling to return.

"In engagements with hostile aircraft nine machines have been brought down and nine driven out of control. Three of our machines are missing.

"In home waters, anti-submarine and convoy patrols have been maintained. Submarines have been sighted and enemy mines have been located and destroyed.
