## CHURCH NOTES

**THE FIRST BAPTIST**  
Rev. R. R. McKay of the Baptist Foreign Mission Board of Ontario and Quebec was the preacher at the morning service on Sunday, which was largely attended. He preached a most illuminating and inspiring sermon on the call of the non-Christian peoples to the Christian churches. It was a masterly review of the present missionary situation, and his appeal for increased offerings for this great work was indeed very forceful. There were 370 present in the Sunday School. At the evening service the church was taxed to its utmost capacity to seat the great audience that gathered. The service was of special interest to men. The pastor made touching reference to the tragic death of Captain Scott and his men and asked the audience to sing softly "Abide With Me." Mr. George Goodwin of the local Y. M. C. A. spoke on the claims of the church upon the men who are outside the church. He began by defining what the church was and then proceeded to emphasize its claims upon men. The pastor followed with a short sermon on the subject, "Should Smith Join the Church?" dealing with three arguments in favor of this union:

1. Because the church relates him to the power necessary for the highest success in life.
2. Because the church furnishes him with the only task adequate to fill manhood.
3. Because the church introduces him to the noblest of fellowships—the fellowship with God without rear and a fellowship with men with service as the impelling motive.

Mr. Broadus Farmer, violinist of Toronto, and Mr. Earl Lund, who contributed two numbers, which were greatly appreciated by the large audience present. "The Day Thou Gavest, Lord, is Ended" brought a most inspiring service to a close. Next Sunday evening the pastor will speak on the subject, "After Smith Joins the Church, What?"

**CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH**  
The Congregational Church was the scene of two bright services on Sunday. In the morning the pastor took his text from Genesis 22:1, "God's Test of Abraham's Faith." Abraham's temptation was a strong trial of his faith; he had many elements in his life to make him happy, and this proving came as lightning from a clear sky. It was a testing, not a temptation. We are all struggling after passing one of these testing milestones in our lives, as Christ's temptations each were an increasing glory for Him. It is in the moral world as in the realm of chemistry, the testing acid proves the value. Yet Abraham stands firm to his faith in God, even though it meant the utter obliteration of his family and his hopes.

Now what caused Abraham to entertain the idea of making this sacrifice? He had been raised in a heathen country where children were sacrificed to idols, so God takes this opportunity to test his faith, and by staying his uplifted hand to denounce to the world forever human sacrifice, teaching us also that we should not let anything which touches us in life weaken our faith in God.
