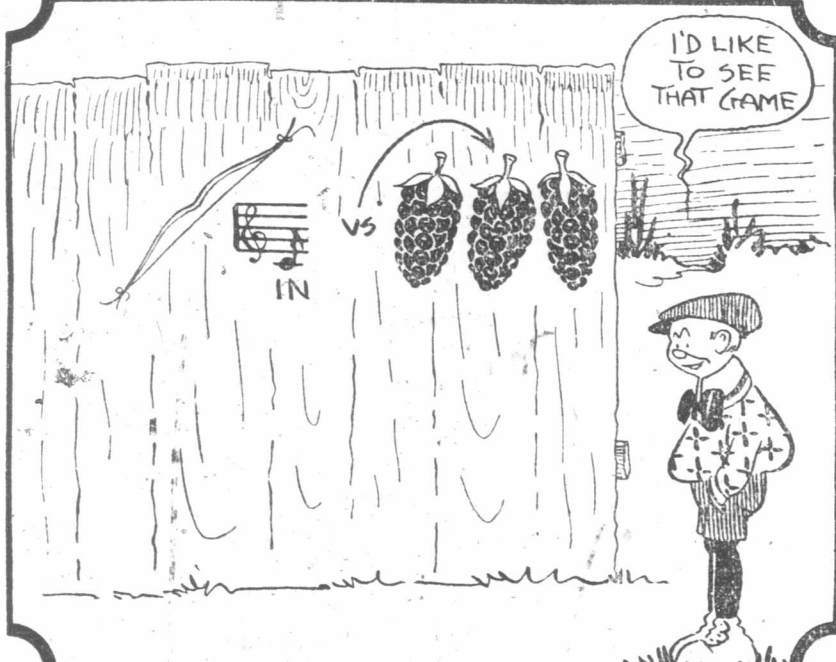

Reach Montreal On Walk Around World

Charlie Kirkman and Fred Shubley Taking the Long Hike.

Fred Shubley and Charlie Kirkman, globe trotters, reached Montreal today on their way around the world. They started from Halifax, Nova Scotia, on October 4, and expect to complete the circuit in three years and thus win a wager of \$20,000 from prominent sportsmen in the Maritime Provinces provided they secure 25,000 signatures of mayor and municipal authorities of the many cities in the world that they may call at in the course of their hike. They will then cross into the United States on their way to San Francisco, where they will embark on a steamer for Australia, Japan, China, India, Asia, Europe and the British Isles and back to Canada.

Burkman is a pioneer long distance walker and is one of the transcontinental hikers who walked from Halifax to Vancouver, completing the trip in 149 days, an average of 26 miles per day.

Relief In Sydney

Public Works Program to Cost \$190,000.

SYDNEY, N.S., Dec. 22.—To relieve the unemployment situation in Sydney during the next few weeks, the City Council last night unanimously approved a program of public works to cost about \$190,000.

A plebiscite will be held on January 10, to get the endorsement of the citizens for a scheme to connect Middle Lake with the city reservoir, clean the reservoir and construct an auxiliary basin in connection with it.

With the steel rail orders on hand, it is felt that these public works will carry the unemployment over the hardest part of the winter.
