### THE PEACE TREATY

It is not surprising that the members of the House of Commons who are opposed to the ratification of the peace treaty as it stands, should follow the lead of American Senators. There were many Americans who never wanted the United States in the war, and never gave more than half-hearted support to the country's war effort. There were also Canadians who objected to Canada participating in the great struggle, and when the last great test arrived put loyalty to their political party before devotion to the Dominion. It is these same men who are doubtful of the peace treaty, and who fear it will in some mysterious way sap the independence and interfere with the sovereignty of the country. What they are really prodding at is any closer alliance with the Mother Country and the other Overseas Dominions. It is all so very absurd apart from the partisan viewpoint. If the war did anything at all it established the status of Canada and the other dominions as nations. And nothing could be more logical than having helped to win the war Canada should have a voice in settling the terms of peace. Indeed, if Canada had been shut out from the Peace Conference none of her public men would have raised a noisier clamor than these same men who are expressing their dissatisfaction with the peace treaty and pointing out the dangers that will come from taking an active part in European affairs. It is not so very long ago that it was universally conceded that this continent could not hold aloof from European affairs. Germany brought European affairs to the United States and to every other race on this continent. This was the reason the United States entered the war. And so far as Canada is concerned as an integral part of the British Empire she cannot keep out of European affairs. Moreover, in this case the Allies in the war have formed a League for the purpose of preserving the peace of the world. But peace cannot be maintained by virtue of good resolutions alone. There must be an agreement among the

DOMINION LAW ON  
RENTALS SUGGESTED  
Toronto, Sept. 11.—Legislation by the Dominion Government to restrict rentals on dwellings to a gross return of 10 per cent. on actual property value will be asked by the Toronto City Council if a recommendation passed by its legislation committee yesterday afternoon is adopted by the Council.

ALLIES HAVE REPLY  
Paris, Sept. 11.—At this morning's session of the Supreme Council of the Peace Conference, the terms of the note to be sent to Germany concerning the suppression of Article 61 of the German constitution relating to Austrian representation in the German parliament were decided upon. The Allies' note, which is in reply to the recent German answer to the original ultimatum from the Allies, will be communicated to the German peace delegation at Versailles this evening. It will be made public later.

Rt. Hon. Arthur J. Balfour, British foreign secretary, attended the session for the last time as a member of the Council. Rt. Hon. Andrew Bonar Law or Viscount Milner, of the British peace delegation, will replace him on the Council.

MONTREAL PAYS \$300,000  
The award of the Board of Arbitration appointed to adjudicate on the differences between the City of Montreal and the Cook Construction Company, in connection with the widening of the city aqueduct, orders the city to pay the company \$308,000 damages.

Claims allowed against the city aggregate \$438,000 of the \$1,775,000 demanded by the company. On the other hand \$130,000 of the city's counter-claim of \$412,000 was allowed by the board.

### TO HAND TREATY TO BULGARIANS SATURDAY

Paris, Sept. 11.—The Supreme Council has decided to present the peace treaty with Bulgaria to the Bulgarian peace mission on Saturday. Probably twenty-one days will be granted the Bulgarians to make observations on the treaty and during that interim it is expected the Conference will take a short vacation.

### MANITOBA VILLAGE SWEEP BY FIRE

Winnipeg, Sept. 11.—Word reached here today that half of the village of Moosehorn, Man., 119 miles north west of Winnipeg, had been destroyed by fire, an estimated loss of \$100,000. The cause of the conflagration is believed to have been the explosion of a gasoline lamp in a local creamery.

REPORTS DENIED.  
Paris, Sept. 11.—Reports tending to indicate that Roumania was negotiating for a separate peace with Hungary were categorically denied today by the Roumanian Press Bureau here. One of the reports was that a Hungarian mission had arrived at Budapest to open separate peace negotiations.

FORMING A CABINET  
FOR ROUMANIANS  
Vienna, Sept. 10, via London, Sept. 11.—The Bratianu Cabinet in Roumania has fallen, according to unofficial reports which reached Vienna from Bucharest today. Take Jonescu is said to be forming a new Government.

NO CHANGE IN POLICY  
REGARDING NORTH RUSSIA  
London, Sept. 11.—Winston Spencer Churchill, Secretary for War, in a statement issued today denied that there been any change in the British policy to evacuate north Russia.

### MONTENEGRO SENDS A PROTEST TO CONFERENCE

Royal Government Wishes to Sign Treaty With Austria.

Paris, Sept. 11.—The Royal Government of Montenegro has sent a protest to the Peace Conference because its representatives were not permitted to sign the treaty with Austria.

"All the Allied and Associated Powers signed the treaty with Austria, even those which did not spill a drop of blood," the protest says. "The Royal Government of Montenegro protests with the utmost energy against the attitude of the Peace Conference and asks the Governments of the great powers to intervene to the end that such a flagrant violation of the honor and rights of Montenegro may be terminated."
