B. in 1916 and 1917 and was lately chosen Rhodes Scholar from New Brunswick.

## President of the National Hockey League Rules on N.B.H.L. Tied Game

Frank Calder's Ruling Sustains Opinion Given Yesterday in The Gleaner—No Pretext Under Which Marysville-Chatham Game Could Be Re-played—Championship Must Be Settled on Points, a Win Counting Two and a Draw One.

"If at the end of a full game two teams are tied, they continue the game until a goal is scored up to a limit of twenty minutes overtime. If the score is then still tied, the match is drawn. In the standing a win counts for two points, a draw one."

### AGREEMENT OF TEAMS WILL HAVE TO STAND

The above is ruling of President Frank Calder of the National Hockey League, who was asked through Geo. MacDonald, superintendent of the Canadian Press, Limited, to give an official ruling for The Gleaner on the situation caused in the New Brunswick Hockey League as a result of the game played by the Marysville and Chatham teams at the Arctic rink, which the teams agreed to call a draw after battling through two overtime periods during which they were unable to break the tie.

All day yesterday The Gleaner was bombarded with telephone and other inquiries as to whether the game was to be replayed or not. Reports were circulated that large guarantees were being offered to have the teams play the game last night and some informed individual actually showed such a story to slip into print. There is, however, no pretext under which the game can be replayed and the players of both clubs and their managers knew it within a short time after they had decided to call it a drawn game, although it is safe to bet that their team realized what they were doing when they allowed the game to go

as a draw before the usual twenty minutes of overtime had expired.

Chatham should have taken chance. Chatham had everything to win and nothing to lose by continuing play until one side had scored or until the prescribed twenty minutes of overtime had been exhausted, but the fact of the matter is that nobody on the ice had an accurate knowledge of the provisions of the N.H.L. rules—under which the N.B.H.L. plays—when such an unexpected situation arose. As stated in The Gleaner yesterday points, not games won and lost, form the basis upon which the championship of the N.B.H.L. must be decided and, if the Fredericton team go to the North Shore and win both their games from Bathurst and Chatham, then Fredericton will have one more point than Chatham and the championship would rest with the local team. If Chatham had lost Thursday's game to Marysville they would have been just as well off insofar as their championship chances were concerned, so why did they not take the desperate chance to break the tie?

Now the question is: Who is going to direct the playing of the Fredericton team on the ice in the closing games of the season.

Fur Expected to Fly Because of the Strained Athletic Relations Between the Two Colleges as a Result of Last Fall's Football Dispute—U. N. B. Taking No Chances.

The final game of the western section of the Intercollegiate Hockey League will be played here next Thursday night, when U. N. B. clashes with Acadia.

Although it may be necessary for U. N.
